

## **MODALITIES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT SCHEME DURING XI PLAN**

The Government of India has conveyed the approval for implementation of Coffee Boards' XI Plan proposals under Development Support Scheme for Coffee for implementation by the Board during the XI Five Year Plan (2007-2012), vide Letter No. 4/4/2007-Plant-B dated. 24<sup>th</sup> March 2008. Under the approved Development Support scheme of XI Plan period (2007-2012), subsidy will be extended to cover the following components for the benefit of coffee growers in traditional coffee growing regions.

- 1. Replantation**
- 2. Water Augmentation, Quality Up- gradation and Pollution Abatement measures**

### **SUBSIDY COMPONENT:-**

The subsidy is provided to different activities under each component subject to certain ceiling prescribed for each activity. The Board will extend subsidy for the growers who avail credit facilities from the financial institutions as well as for the growers who are able to take up the activities through self finance. The details of eligible subsidy as a percentage of unit cost, for different components area as follows:

### **1. Modalities for implementation of Replantation programme**

#### **A. Eligibility Criteria Governing the Grant of Subsidy under Replantation programme**

1. Subsidy is available for re-plantation of existing old Arabica coffee plantations with suitable Arabica cultivars, re-plantation of old Robusta plants with suitable Robusta cultivars in general. However, subsidy is also available for conversion of old Arabica plantations with suitable Robusta cultivars and vice versa subject to the conditions mentioned in the feasibility report.

2. The **area benefited by the re-planting subsidy** under SSGS/SS&MGS Scheme of X Plan **is not eligible** for re-plantation subsidy. However, the Estates where subsidy for vacancy filling has been availed during X Plan period will continue to be eligible under XI Plan period excluding the area for which subsidy has been availed subject to fulfillment of all other conditions.
3. In the normal course, the re-planting subsidy is considered for such areas where the coffee plants in the block/estate have become old, moribund and uneconomical. Therefore, the estates with coffee plants aged above 30 years in case of Arabica and above 40 years in case of Robusta shall be considered for grant of replanting subsidy.
4. The sanction of subsidy is with reference to the fixed unit cost i.e., Rs. 1.00 lakh per Hectare for Arabica and Rs. 0.70 lakh per Hectare for Robusta.
5. The rate of subsidy applicable is 40% of the unit cost for the holdings of upto 2 Ha. ( Rs. 40,000/Ha. for Arabica & Rs. 28,000/Ha. for Robusta); 30% of the unit cost for the holdings of >2 Ha. upto 10 Ha. ( Rs. 30,000/Ha. for Arabica & Rs. 21,000/Ha. for Robusta); and 25% of the unit cost for the individual holdings of above 10 Ha. (Rs. 25,000/Ha. for Arabica & Rs. 17,500/Ha. for Robusta). The rate of subsidy depends on the total size of the holding irrespective of the area re-planted.
6. The admissible subsidy is released in a maximum of 4(four) annual installments as shown in the following tables:

6. The replanted plants of Arabica/Robusta should be of varieties recommended in the feasibility report.
7. It is advantageous and preferable to use the seeds procured from the Coffee Board
8. The subsidy is generally linked to credit provided by Banks/Financial Institutions. However, the Board also extends subsidy where growers are able to take up re-plantation and maintain the replanted area satisfactorily out of their own finance.
9. The individual coffee growers including Hindu Undivided Families (HUFs) Partnership firms and holdings under joint names having coffee holdings are eligible for subsidy under this component. **The Co-operative and Corporate sector coffee estates/holdings are not eligible for subsidy.** The eligibility of the applicants is determined based on the documents submitted along with the application.
10. Applications can be filed either individually or in joint names.

11. **If the estate/area benefited by replantation subsidy changes hands during the tenure of implementation of the re-plantation programme, sanction of subsequent installments of the subsidy, the admissible rate and quantum of subsidy would be determined based on the status of the new owner. For this purpose, the new owner has to furnish complete set of documents pertaining to the area/estate.**
12. The application/ claim for grant of subsidy which is not accompanied by the required documents and/or not fulfilling the eligibility criteria/stipulated norms is liable for rejection by the sanctioning authority of the Board.
13. All payments shall be released by Account Payee cheques/electronic funds transfers.
14. Wilful suppression of material facts would make the applicant liable for legal action. Such applicant shall be black-listed and the particulars of such claimant shall be notified in the Website of the Coffee Board.

**B. Documents required to be submitted along with Application for issuing Feasibility Report for Replantation:**

1. Application & Self Declaration by the Applicant/s (in duplicate) in the prescribed format.
2. Proof of photo identity of the applicant/s such as Driving License, Ration Card, Electoral Photo Identity Card (EPIC).
3. Proof of Land Ownership and Crops Grown – Copy of CRC/s & in case CRC is not available, Copy of Patta or Krishi Pass Book or Khatha Extract along with RTCs for all Survey Nos. having coffee/ Chitta & Adangal / Possession Certificate as the case may be.
4. Rough sketch of the estate along with check bandhi/boundaries marked and also the block where the replanting activity is proposed to be taken up indicating the spot with boundaries marked and signed by the applicant.

**C. Documents required for Claiming Replanting Subsidy:**

1. Claim Statement in the prescribed format (in duplicate) in case of first instalment of subsidy.
2. Copy of Loan Sanction Order in case of Bank Financed activities for release of first installment of subsidy.
3. Claim statement in the prescribed format along with utilization certificate for the amount of loan and subsidy released earlier in case of second and subsequent installments.
4. Pre Receipt by the Applicant.

**D. Procedure for Processing Subsidy Applications/Claims**

- Obtaining Feasibility Report before taking up the re-plantation activity for both Bank financed and Self financed cases is compulsory. Any claims for grant of subsidy without fulfilling this criterion **shall not** be considered. However with regard to replantation undertaken during 2007-08, this condition stands relaxed.
- Under this programme, clean re-plantation is encouraged as it gives an opportunity to the growers to undertake innovative and improved planting design. However, re-plantation by interlining method is also accepted with the condition that the old plants shall be removed by the end of second year after harvesting the standing crop for 1 year.
- Re-plantation subsidy will be released in 4 annual instalments viz., 40% during the first year of planting, 20% each during the second, third and fourth years (before the end of respective financial year) of the total subsidy sanctioned.
- In case of re-plantation by interlining, the amount of first instalment of subsidy shall be limited to 50% of the subsidy eligible in the normal course for clean replanting. However, the remaining 50% of first instalment subsidy and the eligible amount of 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment would be released together provided all other conditions are fulfilled.
- Wherever the re-plantation is done by interlining in between the old plants, the claim for release of 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment shall be submitted by October after removing the old plants completely by the end of June month of the next calendar year from the planting year and ensuring complete gap filling and proper care/maintenance of young plants.
- In case the old plants in the replanted area are not completely removed after harvesting the first crop, the grower will loose the right for grant/release of 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment of subsidy. Further, if the grower retains the old plants beyond the end of 2<sup>nd</sup> year, grant/release of 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> instalments of replanting subsidy to such growers will not be considered.

### **Phases of release of Subsidy:**

#### **i) In Cases of Bank Financed Activities :**

##### **FIRST YEAR :**

1. The growers will submit the applications for taking up replanting to the concerned bank by the end of October of previous year of planned replanting.
2. Bank will process the application for the credit worthiness of the applicant and if satisfied will refer the case to the Office of the concerned Liaison Officer (Junior Liaison Officer(JLO) / Senior Liaison Officer (SLO) of Coffee Board to issue Feasibility Report before the end of November month.
3. Extension Officer of the Board will inspect the estate to assess the technical feasibility and issue the feasibility report to the grower and to the concerned Bank with specific recommendations in terms of area to be replanted, variety and spacing to be adopted etc. If it is found infeasible, the JLO/SLO will report the matter to the concerned Deputy Director (Extn) and the DDE in turn will examine the matter and communicate the rejection with reasons to the Bank and Applicant by the end of December. No rejection shall be communicated at any level below the rank of Deputy Director (Extn).
4. On receipt of the feasibility report, the Bank will sanction the loan and inform the

- applicant as well as the concerned Deputy Director (Extn) of the Board by ensuing January.
5. The Bank will also release first instalment of loan to the grower to carry out pre-planting activities like raising nursery, line marking, opening/closing planting pits etc.
  6. After completion of re-planting in August & September, the grower would submit the subsidy claim by October of the planting year along with the necessary documents to the concerned Liaison Officer (SLO/JLO) of the Coffee Board with a request to release the 1<sup>st</sup> installment of subsidy and within 3 months after completion of planting.
  7. Usually 6-8 months old seedlings are used for replanting both in clean replanting as well as interlining. However, planting of 18 – 20 months old coffee seedlings is allowed only under clean re-plantation provided these seedlings are transferred to secondary nursery/secondary beds after 8 months and all the precautions as recommended by the Coffee Board are taken for maintenance of secondary nursery.
  8. On receipt of the claim statement and the relevant records, the Extension Personnel of the Office of SLO/JLO will carryout the spot inspection to verify the completion of re-plantation activity in respect of the area for which subsidy is claimed. After satisfying about the admissibility of the claim, the claim along with his recommendation will be forwarded by the JLO/SLO to the concerned Deputy Director (Extn.).
  9. The Deputy Director (Extn), after scrutinizing the claim and satisfying himself about the admissibility of the claim, **will release the 1<sup>st</sup> instalment of subsidy amount directly to the concerned Bank** following due sanction process, for crediting to the account of the applicant with intimation to the applicant as well as concerned JLO/SLO.
  10. All the subsidy claims will be settled by way of Account Payee cheque and the settlement through Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) payment will also be considered wherever the facility is available.

### **SECOND YEAR :**

1. During the second year of planting, the grower would submit the claim by October for release of II instalment of subsidy after filling up vacancies, removal of old plants and undertake necessary cultural operations to the concerned JLO/SLO.
2. On receipt of the claim, the JLO/SLO will carryout the spot inspection of the replanted area. After ascertaining the fact that all the old plants are completely removed, that the gaps are filled ensuring no vacancies and also that the young plants are properly maintained, he will recommend for release of eligible subsidy to the concerned Deputy Director (Extn).
3. The Deputy Director (Extn) after scrutinizing the claim, will release the 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment of subsidy amount to the concerned Bank following due sanction process for crediting to the account of the applicant with intimation to the applicant as well as concerned JLO/SLO.
4. The Bank will release the instalment of subsidy and eligible loan amount to the grower.

### **THIRD YEAR :**

1. The grower would submit the claim for release of III instalment of subsidy by October to the concerned JLO/SLO after the young plants attain the desired topping height and after undertaking necessary cultural operations.
2. The JLO/SLO will inspect the replanted block and after ascertaining the fact that at least 80% of plants have attained the desired topping height and also after care of the young plants is satisfactory, will recommend for release of 3<sup>rd</sup> installment of subsidy to the concerned Dy. Director (Extn).
3. The Deputy Director (Extn) after scrutinizing the claim, will release the 3<sup>rd</sup> instalment of subsidy amount to the concerned Bank after following due sanction process for crediting to the account of the applicant with intimation to the applicant as well as concerned JLO/SLO.
4. Bank will credit the 3<sup>rd</sup> instalment of subsidy and loan eligible installment to the grower's account.

### **FOURTH YEAR :**

1. After ensuring the maintenance of the replanted area, the grower would prefer the claim for release of 4<sup>th</sup> installment subsidy to the Board.
2. The Board will inspect and after ascertaining the maintenance of the replanted area in terms of growth and condition of plants to the desired level, will recommend for release of 4<sup>th</sup> installment of subsidy to the concerned Deputy Director(Extn).
3. The Deputy Director (Extn) after scrutinizing the claim, will release the 3<sup>rd</sup> instalment of subsidy amount to the concerned Bank after following due sanction process for crediting to the account of the applicant with intimation to the applicant as well as concerned JLO/SLO.
4. Bank will credit the 4<sup>th</sup> instalment of subsidy and eligible loan installment to the grower's account.

#### **ii) In Cases of Self Financed Activities:**

1. The applicant shall submit an application in the prescribed format along with the necessary documents by the end October of previous year of planting and obtain Feasibility Report from the Office of the concerned JLO/SLO of the Board to become eligible for claiming subsidy.
2. On receipt of the Application alongwith the relevant documents, the Extension Personnel of the Office of JLO /SLO will scrutinize the documents, carryout field inspection and verify the information furnished by the applicant with specific reference to the existing conditions of the area proposed for replanting and intimate the applicant permitting him to take up the replantation activity through feasibility report. If it is not found feasible, the JLO/SLO will report the matter the concerned Deputy Director (Extn) and the DDE in turn will examine the matter and communicate the rejection with reasons to the applicant by the end of December. **No rejection shall be communicated at any level below the rank of Deputy Director (Extn).**
3. After receiving the feasibility report, the applicant will carry out the replanting activity and on completion of the same, he/she will submit the subsidy claim by the end of October of planting year in the prescribed format along with the

relevant documents to the concerned JLO/SLO to release the 1<sup>st</sup> installment of subsidy and within 3 months after completion of replanting.

4. The subsidy will be released to the grower/applicant directly by way of Account Payee Cheque or EFT if facility available. The conditions, timelines and procedure for preferring claims and processing of the same for the release of second, third and fourth installment remain same as indicated for Bank financed cases .

## Modalities for implementation of Water Augmentation,

### Quality Up-gradation & Pollution Abatement

#### A. Eligibility Criteria Governing the Grant of Subsidy:-

1. The individual coffee growers including Hindu Undivided Families (HUFs) Partnership firms and holdings under joint names having coffee holding up to a maximum of 20 Ha. are eligible for subsidy under this component. **The Co-operative and Corporate sector coffee estates/holdings are not eligible for subsidy.** The eligibility of the applicants is based on the documents submitted along with the application.
2. Applications can be filed either individually or in joint names. In either case the applicants need to satisfy the above eligibility in terms of ceiling on holding size of 20 Ha.
3. The main criteria for determining the eligible subsidy in each case shall be the extent/ area of the estate that would be benefited by the activity/infrastructure created. This criteria also to be adopted in determining and granting the eligible subsidy in respect of the Bank financed claims wherein the extent of area mortgaged for availing loan would be less than the total extent in possession of the applicant.
4. An applicant can avail the eligible subsidy for one or all the components/ activities at the same time or at different times during the XI Plan period if the subsidy for the same component/ activity **has not been availed from the Coffee Board for the same area during IX & X Plan periods.**
5. The water augmentation structures shall have to be on the estate/within the vicinity of the estate. The quality up-gradation structures and water augmentation infrastructure may be created either at the applicant's estate or any other land belonging to the applicant.
6. In case of joint applications, the subsidy shall be eligible for the facility created for common benefit of all the applicants/total area owned by the applicants within the coffee estate of any one of the applicants or outside the estate wherein the land belongs to one of the applicants and the right of the ownership is established. However, **no subsidy shall be considered for the area already benefited under joint application** in respect of the subsequent claims made separately in individual name after separation or partition of the area **during the same 5 Year Plan period.**
7. The application/ claim for grant of subsidy which is not accompanied by the required documents and not fulfilling the eligibility criteria/stipulated norms is liable for rejection by the sanctioning authority of the Board.
8. All payments shall be released by Account Payee cheques/electronic funds transfers.
9. Wilful suppression of material facts would make the applicant liable for legal action. Such applicant shall be black-listed and the particulars of such claimant

shall be notified in the Website of the Coffee Board.

**B. Documents required to be submitted along with Application for issuing Feasibility Report:**

1. Application & Self Declaration by the Applicant/s (in duplicate) in the prescribed format.
2. Proof of photo identity of the applicant/s such as Driving License, Ration Card, Electoral Photo Identity Card (EPIC) issued by the Election Commission etc.,
3. Proof of Land Ownership and Crops Grown – Copy of CRC/s & in case CRC is not available, Copy of Patta or Krishi Pass Book or Khatha Extract along with RTCs for all Survey Nos. having coffee/ Chitta & Adangal / Possession Certificate as the case may be.
4. Rough sketch of the estate along with check bandhi/boundaries marked and also the spot where the activity/infrastructure is proposed to be taken up with boundaries marked and signed by the applicant.
5. Quotation/Proforma Invoice having TIN in respect of Equipment/Machinery/ Bore well.
6. Plan & Estimates in respect of works like construction of Water Tank, Check Dam, Drying Yard, Pulper Shed, Godown etc., prepared by Qualified Engineer.

**C. Documents required for Claiming Subsidy :**

1. Claim Statements in the prescribed format (in duplicate).
2. Copy of Loan Sanction Order in case of Bank Financed activities.
3. Copy of Invoice/Bill with TIN in case of Machinery/Equipment/ Bore well.
4. Completion report indicating the amount utilized for the activity by the applicant
5. Pre Receipt by the Applicant.

**D. Procedure for Processing Subsidy Applications/Claims:**

**i) In Cases of Self Financed Activities:**

1. The applicant shall submit an application in the prescribed format along with the necessary documents before taking up the proposed activity and obtain Feasibility Report from the concerned JLO/SLO of the Board to become eligible for claiming subsidy. Any claims for grant of subsidy without

fulfilling this pre-requisite criterion shall not be considered excepting the specific cases wherein the activities were completed during 2007-08 and wherein specific relaxation is given by the competent authority of the Board.

2. On receipt of the Application along with the relevant documents, the JLO/SLO will scrutinize the documents, carryout field inspection and verify the information furnished by the applicant with reference to the existing facilities on the estate and intimate the applicant permitting him to take up the activity through feasibility report. If it is not found feasible, the JLO/SLO will furnish the report to the concerned Deputy Director(Extn) and the DDE in turn inform the applicant accordingly after due examination of the case.
3. After receiving the inspection report, the applicant will carry out the connected activity and on completion of the same, he/she will submit the subsidy claim in the prescribed format alongwith the relevant documents to the concerned office of the JLO/SLO as soon as the work is completed and in any case within 1 year from the date of issue of Feasibility Report
4. On receipt of the claim statement and the relevant records, the Extension Personnel attached to the Office of JLO/SLO will carryout the spot inspection to verify the completion of activity for which subsidy is claimed. He will satisfy himself about the admissibility of the claim based on physical verification and available records and forward the claim alongwith his recommendation, physical verification report etc., to the concerned Deputy Director (Extn).
5. The Deputy Director (Extn) after scrutinizing the claim and satisfying himself about the admissibility of the claim based on the available records will release the subsidy amount **after sanction of eligible amount by the Competent Authority** directly to the applicant with intimation to the concerned JLO/SLO.
6. All the subsidy claims will be settled by way of Account Payee cheque drawn in the name of beneficiary and the settlement through Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) will also be considered wherever the facility is available.

**ii) In Cases of Bank Financed Activities :**

1. In respect of the growers/applicants who approach the Banks for loans to take up the activities/components covered under the scheme, the Bank may forward the case/proposal to office of the local JLO/SLO of the Board for issue of Feasibility Report.
2. Based on the Banks request, the grower shall submit an application in the prescribed format along with the necessary documents before taking up the proposed activity and obtain Feasibility Report from the concerned JLO/SLO of the Board to become eligible for claiming subsidy. Any claims for grant of subsidy without fulfilling this pre-requisite criterion shall not be considered.

3. The Extension Personnel of the Office of JLO/SLO shall conduct inspection of the spot and verify the information furnished by the applicant with reference to the existing facilities on the estate and intimate the Bank about the permissibility to take up the activity through Feasibility Report. If it is not found feasible, the JLO/SLO will report the matter the concerned Deputy Director(Extn) and the DDE in turn will communicate the rejection with reasons to the Bank/Applicant after examination of the case.
4. After receipt of the Feasibility Report from the concerned Liaison Officer of the Board, the Bank may sanction the loan to the applicant for the proposed activity.
5. Thereafter, the applicant will undertake the activity and on completion of the concerned activity will submit the subsidy claim alongwith a copy of the loan sanction order and work completion report either through the respective Bank or directly to the concerned JLO/SLO as soon as the work is completed and within 1 year from the date of issue of Feasibility Report.
6. On receipt of the claim statement and the relevant documents, the JLO/SLO will carryout the spot inspection to verify the completion of activity for which subsidy is claimed. He will satisfy himself about the admissibility of the claim based on physical verification and available records and forward the claim alongwith his recommendation, physical verification report etc., to the concerned Deputy Director(Extn).
7. The Deputy Director(Extn) after scrutinizing the claim and satisfying himself about the admissibility of the claim based on the available records will release the subsidy amount to the Bank after following the due sanction process for crediting the same to the applicants' Bank Account with intimation to the concerned JLO/SLO.
8. All the subsidy claims will be settled by way of Account Payee cheque drawn in the name of beneficiary and the settlement through Electronic Transfer payment will also be considered wherever the facilities area available.

## DETAILS OF UNIT COST STRUCTURE AND ELIGIBLE AMOUNT OF SUBSIDY FOR DIFFERENT ACTIVITIES

### 2. WATER AUGMENTATION:-

- Financial incentives will be provided to facilitate water augmentation by construction/ excavation of water storage tanks, construction of open/ring well, drilling of bore well etc. for water harvesting & procurement of irrigation equipment for providing irrigation that will improve production/productivity.
- Under water harvesting structure subsidy will be eligible either for construction of water storage tank or construction of open/ring well with installation of pump or drilling of bore well with installation of submersible pump.
- The construction of water storage tank could be below the ground level or above the ground level with pucca construction. However, eligible subsidy would be based on dimension of the water tank and unit cost applicable to the size of holdings.
- The amount of eligible subsidy for different sized holdings under water augmentation viz., one of the activity under water harvesting structure like water storage tank or bore well or open well/ ring well and procurement of sprinkler /drip irrigation equipment **together applied at one time or at different times shall be limited to 25% of the unit cost prescribed for the respective size of holding or Rs. 1.50 lakh whichever is less.**

### 3. QUALITY UPGRADATION:-

- Financial incentives will be provided to facilitate quality up-gradation activities by installation of pulping unit, construction of drying yard and store house/godown.
- Under installation of pulping unit, subsidy will be eligible for different items like procurement of pulper, washer and motive power machinery as well as for other civil works viz., construction of pulper shed, fruit receiving vat, siphon tank and fermentation tank. The eligible subsidy for different category of growers is determined based on the unit cost prescribed for type of machinery/equipment and other civil works.
- The eligible subsidy for construction of drying yard and godown is determined based on the dimension and unit cost prescribed for different sized holdings.
- The total amount of subsidy under quality up-gradation programme for different activities put together viz., installation of pulping unit, construction of drying yard and godown would be limited to 20% of the unit cost prescribed for the respective size of holding or Rs. 1.50 lakh, whichever is lower.

#### **4. POLLUTION ABATEMENT MEASURES:**

- Subsidy of 20% of the unit cost will be extended for combating the pollutants arising out of the coffee effluents through ETP structures in the form of lagoons.
- The ETPs upto 10 Ha. size of holdings could be excavation of earth with lining of side walls and bottom of the tanks by polythene sheet. However, the ETP structures for >10 Ha. upto 20 Ha. category of holdings are to be pucca construction with stone/brick masonry work
- Other technologies recommended by the respective Pollution Control Boards of the State will also be considered provided its efficacy is accepted by the Board.
